Rotational Business Apprenticeship – opportunity

Yeovil College's successful Rotational Business Apprenticeship scheme is now open for applications! The programme works so that every 7 months, apprentices will work in a new department across Yeovil College, such as HR, Finance, IT, Marketing and more. Apprentices will gain experience in:

- Customer service, HR & communications
- Event planning & coordination
- Social media & marketing
- IT systems & spreadsheets
- Office administration, and more!

This is open to School or College/Sixth Form leavers. Applications close on Monday 24th November and learners can apply to a regular Full Time Yeovil College course at the same time. If successful, the Assessment Centre will take place on 2nd December, and apprentices would begin August 2026.
